before departure, then set off under hazy skies. Past the oil islands, winds built to 20 knots, the boat heeled, we reefed, and laughter carried us across. By evening we were snug on a mooring at 4th of July Cove, emerald water beneath us and a glowing full moon above—though the howling wind made for a restless night. Day two brought a hike to Banning House Lodge, snorkeling among Garibaldi, and even a close-quarters pump-out at Two Harbors that tested both seamanship and humor.
